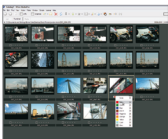


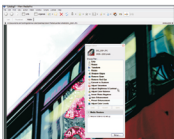
# iView MediaPro3

There are plenty of methods for categorising your images.



The software lets you organise and present your pictures with ease.

If you're snap happy with your digital camera, then chances are your computer's hard drive is stacked up with hundreds of images. Of course, it's great having all of these shots at your fingertips but how many times have you gone to find a photograph only to have to trudge through folders worth of data to locate it?

Most image-editing software programs come bundled with a browser to help you locate your files, but these can sometimes be no more than an elaborate file viewer, with no means for categorising or sorting your shots. Cue the latest version of iView MediaPro, a software program designed to manage your digital files.

It's an extremely powerful program, which is simple to use and makes light work of sorting a huge number of files, making it ideal for both professionals and hobbyists.

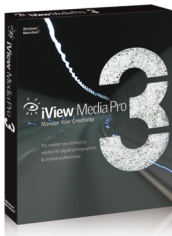
Open up the program and you will be requested to drag your chosen image files onto main workspace of iView MediaPro3 to create a new Catalog. You can either move a whole folder or drag files one by one - either way, your images will all be included in your Catalog.

If you are using a Mac, your operating system will track any moves you make to your original image file, but unfortunately, this does not work for Windows system. Once your thumbnails are displayed you can label them with colour codes, view them in lightbox mode, email them directly to your family and friends, or make essential adjustments using the in-built image editor for fixes, such as Brightness and Contrast, Red Eye Removal or Grain Removal.

By far the most valuable of tools available in iView MediaPro3 is the ability to assign keywords to your

thumbnail images. Working through the photographs in your Catalog, you can select individual thumbnails and add keywords, categories, scenes or subject modes using the information in the side panel. When this information has been added you can search for relevant images by simply typing in your terms in a keyword search entry box. Hit the Return key and the thumbnails displayed in your Catalog will be automatically filtered to show only the images that match your search terms.

If you only have a small number of images then you can probably get away with categorising your images by your own means. But if you're feeling swamped by your ever-expanding collection of shots, then this purchase will prove to be invaluable.



## FINAL VERDICT
